IMPORTANT SCHOLARSHIP TIPS AND DETAILS:

Local scholarships are good scholarships!

Check with the college, trade school, department, or university. As you apply to the college, contact the admissions and/or financial aid departments to find scholarships. Sometimes departments offer incentives to build their programs. These often have winter deadlines.

Use your resources. Let us help you. We can answer questions about applications. We can review your applications and even help with your essays! See Mrs. Keuter or Talent Search and Upward Bound Counselors.

Look closely to find where to send the completed applications. Some local scholarships ask you to turn them in to Mrs. Keuter or Mrs. Hyatt, but most require you to mail it in yourself.

Contact the businesses in your neighborhood; ask them if they have any scholarships available for graduating seniors.

You should NEVER have to pay to apply for a scholarship. If they ask for money, walk away.

CUT, PASTE & REVISE: Save the essays you write on your college applications and scholarship applications, they may come in handy when you fill out the next one.

Notifications: Keep a copy of anything that you mail away. Notification of winners comes in different ways and at different times.
