## Warrenton Winter Sports Season

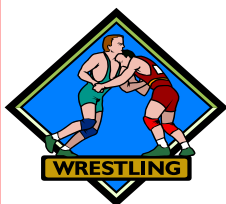


Warrenton Athletics would like to recognize the following athletes for their individual successes this winter.

## Earn College Credits While in High School

Dear Parents of Current Sophomores and Juniors: There are two ways to earn college credit while in high school:



1. Dual Enrollment
2. Simultaneous Enrollment/Expanded Options

**Dual Enrollment** is when you take a college class for credit on WHS Campus during the school day. Currently, WHS offers college-level Spanish, Math, and Writing. If a student qualifies, he/she will earn both high school and college credit at the same time. The courses will require a fee, but much less than the cost of a college course off campus.

**Simultaneous Enrollment** is when a student takes a class on the Clatsop Community College Campus while still in high school. Although books, fees, and transportation are the responsibility of the student, WHS will pay the tuition for qualifying courses.

### ASBESTOS MANAGEMENT FOR WARRENTON SCHOOLS

In the past, asbestos was used extensively in building materials because of its insulating, sound absorbing and fire retarding capabilities. Virtually any building constructed before the late 1970's contains some asbestos. The primary concern arises when these materials are damaged or begin to deteriorate since the particles can cause cancer and asbestosis.

In general, the plan for asbestos management has four annual requirements: The district must publish this information annually, educate and train its employees about asbestos and how to deal with it, follow set plans designed to minimize the disturbance of asbestos containing materials, and survey those materials on a regular basis. A copy of the plan is available for public inspection in the District Office during regular working hours.

It is the intention of the district to comply with federal, state and local regulations regarding asbestos and to take whatever steps are necessary to ensure students and employees a healthy, safe environment in which to learn and work.
